

The Farthest North Chapter of the Alaska Peace Officers Association provides three \$1,000 scholarships annually through endowments with the University of Alaska Fairbanks (UAF). The scholarships are administered by the UAF Justice Department through the UAF Financial Aid Office:

- Roland “Skip” Chevalier Memorial Fund was established to provide awards for students of junior or senior class standing majoring in justice at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, with the intent to pursue a bachelors or masters degree in justice. Qualifications Pertaining to Recipients:
 - Recipient should demonstrate motivation, and academic and leadership potential.
 - Recipient must be in good academic standing.
 - Recipient must be a full-time student attending the University of Alaska Fairbanks.
 - Recipient must be majoring in justice and be of junior or senior class standing.
 - Preference will be given to students who intend to pursue a career in Alaska.

- Troy Duncan Memorial Justice Award was established to provide awards for students of junior or senior class standing majoring in justice at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, who have intent to pursue a bachelors or masters degree in justice. Qualifications Pertaining to Recipients:
 - Recipient should demonstrate motivation, and academic and leadership potential.
 - Recipient must be in good academic standing.
 - Recipient must be a full-time student attending the University of Alaska Fairbanks.
 - Recipient must be majoring in justice and be of junior or senior class standing.
 - Preference will be given to students who intend to pursue a career in Alaska.

- John Kevin Lamm Memorial Scholarship was established to provide awards for freshman and sophomore students with a demonstrated commitment to public safety attending at the University of Alaska Fairbanks. Students need not be justice majors so long as their interest and commitment to public safety is adequately represented through the essay requirement. Qualifications Pertaining to Recipients:
 - Recipient should demonstrate motivation, and academic and leadership potential.
 - Recipient must be in good academic standing.
 - Recipient must be a full-time student attending the University of Alaska Fairbanks
 - Recipient must have a demonstrated commitment to public safety (i.e. involvement in community).
 - Preference will be given to students who are involved in law enforcement exploring or students with an interest in law enforcement or legal professions.

Application and Selection Process: Students shall apply through the UAF Financial Aid Office (<http://www.uaf.edu/finaid/scholarships/>) or the Department of Justice (using the attached application) on or before **February 15th** of each year. Essay information will be paired with other information from the students’ academic record and supplied to the Justice Department Chair. The Justice Department Chair will then arrange a scholarship selection meeting with the Farthest North Chapter of the APOA for discussion and final selection. Scholarship recipient and alternate names will be submitted to the UAF Financial Aid Office for student verification, award, and notification.
